

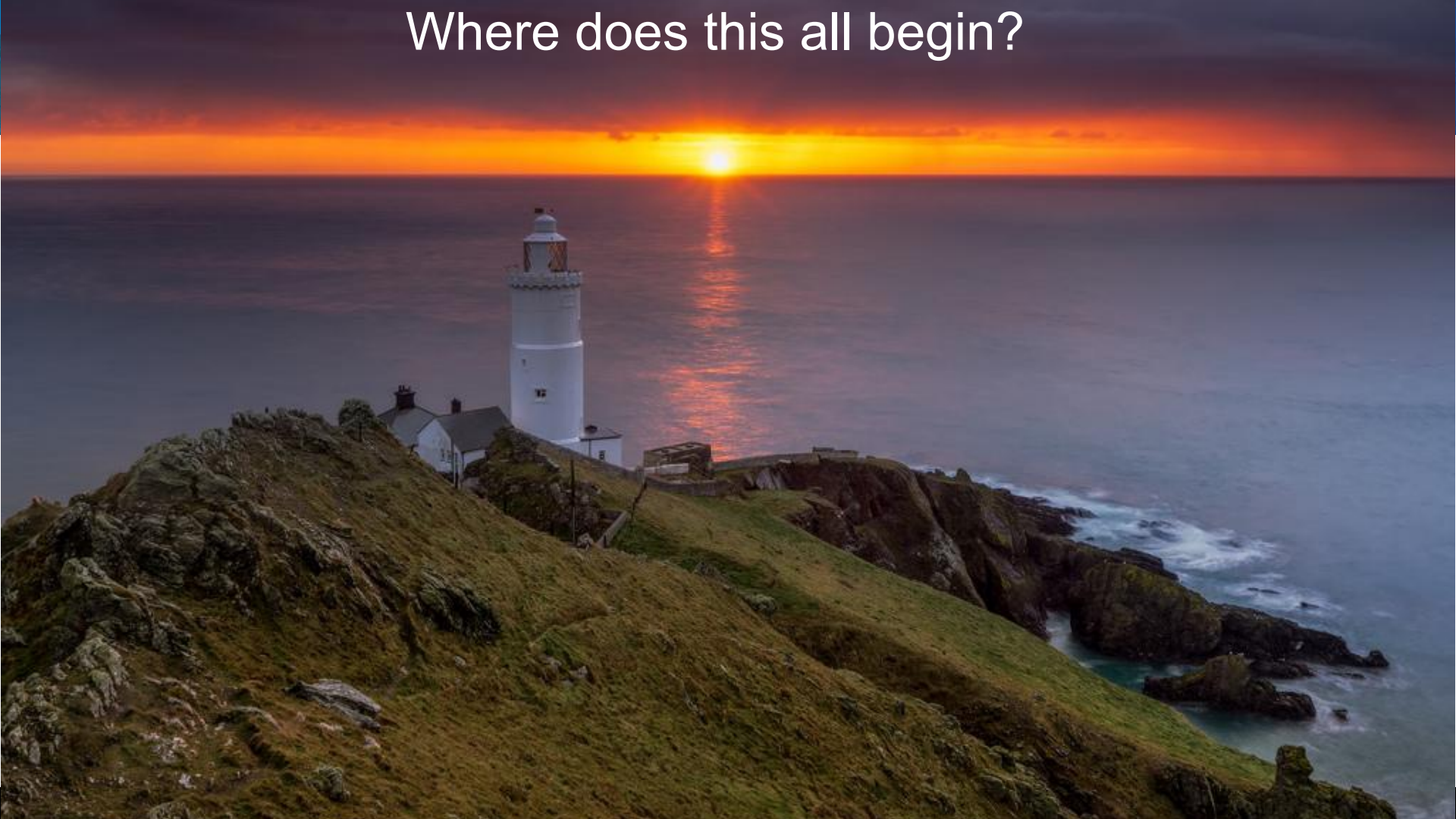

Three Sheets of Paper

On a sheet of paper, take five minutes and time yourself and write the list of everything you think you know about your project.

Storage & testing & community & internal + external divides &

large possible partners but weird NDAs & need stronger guidelines for docs & effective testing

Three Sheets of Paper

- Take a sheet of paper.
- Draw two axis lines on it, so that you have 4 quadrants on it.
- Write down 'technical', 'political' on one axis.
- 'Internal', 'external' on the other axis.

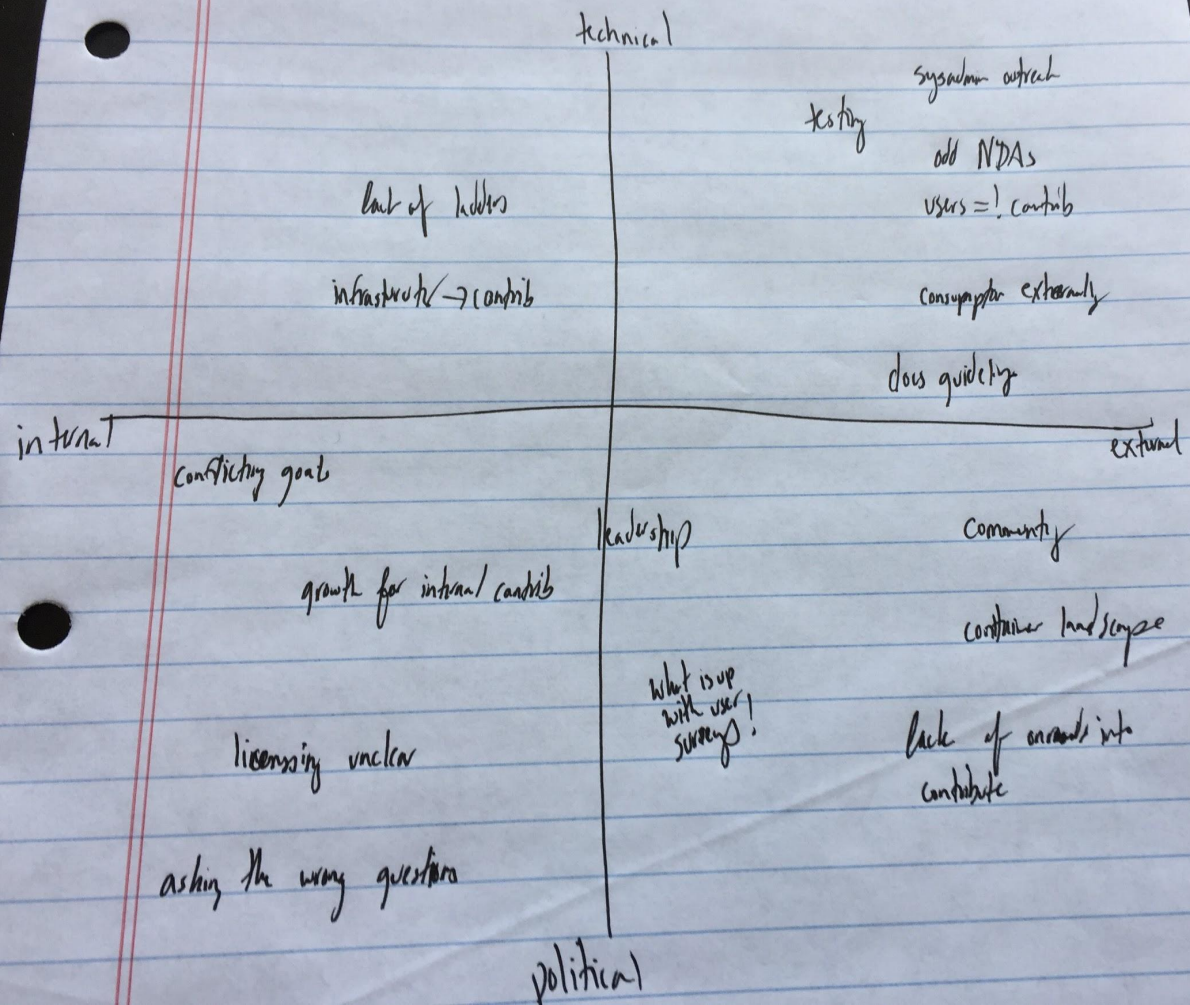
Now take the list.

Three Sheets of Paper

Between the pieces you know on that quadrant paper, the list of things that you know you need to do, the 30-60-90 and your list of things that's missing, you pretty much have your marching orders to calibrate your project.

Extra credit is extra credit, after all.

Three Sheets of Paper

Your initial list is your discovery work.

Your quadrant paper is your survey paper.

Your 30-60-90 is your priorities put into action.

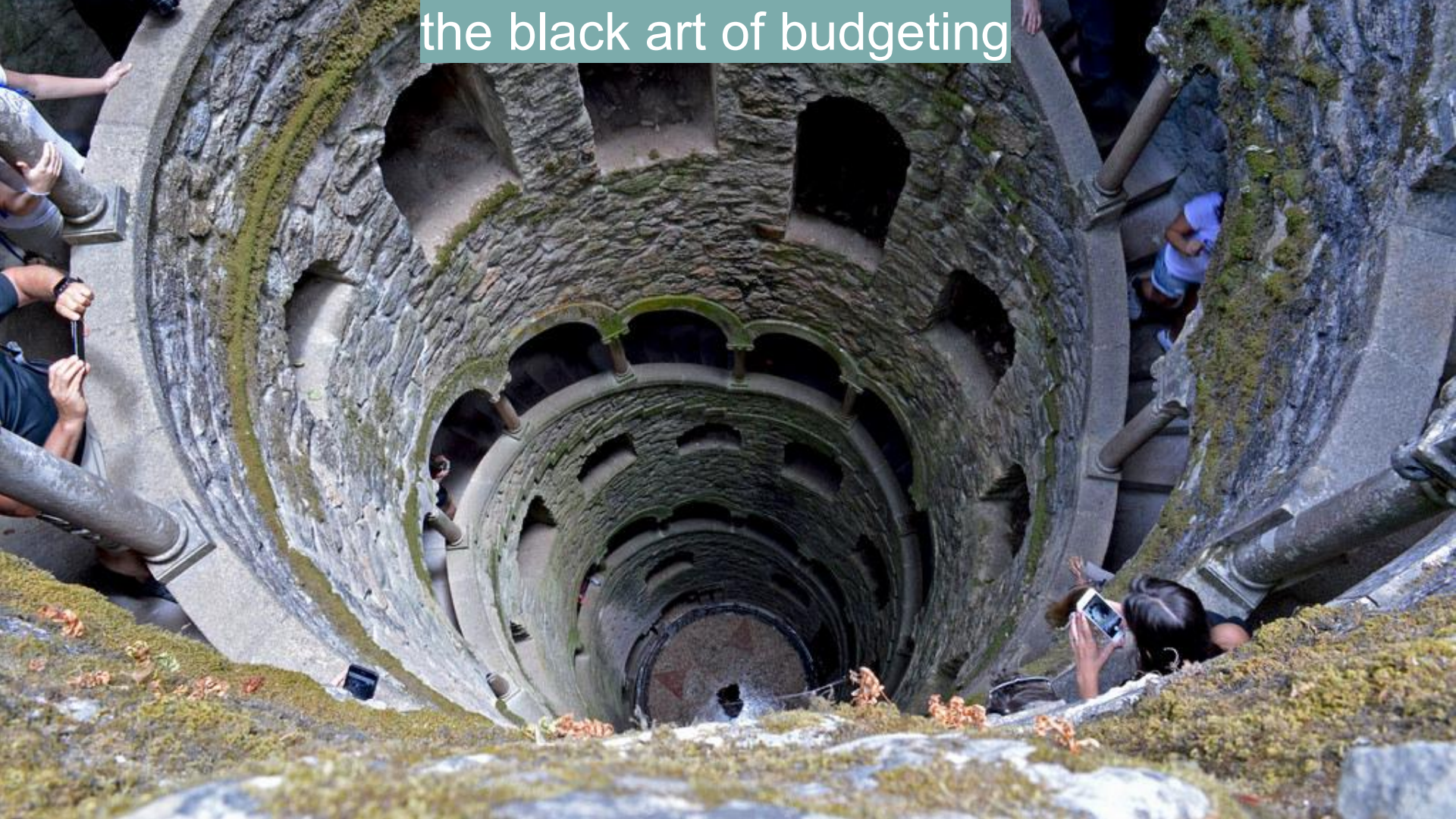
